



AETF Board Meeting – Public Summary

Date: Wednesday, 28 May 2025 | **Platform:** Online (Microsoft Teams)

Purpose

In line with the AETF Board's commitment to communication and transparency, this document summarises key discussions and outcomes from the Board meeting of 28 May 2025, excluding confidential, sensitive, or commercially restricted information.

Attendance

Chaired by the AETF President with the Board of Directors present, alongside the AETF Advisor and Technical Director.

Key Updates and Outcomes

1. Committees and Governance

The Board reviewed the committee application process and confirmed establishment of a broad set of AETF committees to support delivery of the AETF programme. The Board noted strong interest across Europe and emphasised transparency, accountability, and cooperation with member countries. Committee chair roles and representative structures were confirmed for key areas, with further clarity to be addressed through the wider statutes review.

2. International Cooperation

The Board noted positive engagement with partners outside Europe and supported continued cooperation initiatives focused on seminars, knowledge exchange, and future joint activities in support of long-term development.

3. Digital Development: Website and Branding

Progress on the new AETF website and brand materials was reviewed. The website build is at an advanced stage and will act as the key platform for publishing updates, event information, and organisational communications.



4. AETF Ranking System

The Board received an update on the launch and continued refinement of the AETF Ranking System, supporting athlete development, competition pathways, and visibility. Further public guidance will be shared through AETF channels.

5. Participation in External Multi-Sport Events

The Board discussed participation in a European school-sport multi-sport event and supported appropriate promotion through AETF communications and direct outreach to member countries.

6. Athlete Participation Matters

The Board discussed international participation framework developments and confirmed that clarification will be sought through the appropriate international channels to ensure member countries have clear guidance for future events.

7. Education and Health Promotion

The Board noted the successful delivery of the first AETF webinar on safe weight management for competition, with strong attendance and positive feedback. Continued development of webinars and educational resources was supported, with improved advance communication for future sessions.

Next Steps

Key priorities include communicating outcomes of the committee application process, organising a committee chair coordination meeting, continuing website/branding work, advancing statutes review, and maintaining structured member communications.
